- Approval of September 20, 2019 Minutes motion to approve minutes by Stephanie Walker & seconded by Phyllis Bratton – vote passed – 0 opposed – 0 abstain – Motion carried
- 3) POLARIS Update (Allbee)

The reload of data was completed 9/30/2019. Some issues have improved such as due dates/fines –but de-duplication of bib records has gotten worse. Innovative is unsure of the reason why and the issue has been escalated to higher-level management. This issue needs to be fixed prior to GO-LIVE. Kotrba decided to send a copy of database to Backstage who is able to run the data through their de-dupe process in order to supply us with the opportunity to see if they are able to do better. Their reports will help us determine if any of our bibs are to blame for the problems we are seeing. Data testing by library has decreased significantly. It is expected to pick up again once libraries have gone through training sessions. In person training sessions for Circulation has had participation by 34 of 49 libraries. Follow-up online sessions will occur after training is completed. 12 of 17 libraries have signed up for in-person cataloging

training. All libraries involved with acquisitions and serials have signed up to take the in-person training. The Polaris Cataloging User Group has been meeting weekly. The Polaris Circulation User Group will be starting within the next couple of weeks. Because Polaris is more integrated regarding configuration, libraries are discussing more to configure system correctly. Ennen expressed appreciation for the opportunity to participate in training this week.

4) ALMA Update (Allbee)

Migration forms have been distributed to libraries to define data & policies for data transfer from ALEPH to ALMA. Forms are due October 30, 2019. Basecamp is a headache to use for consortia. Linda - her email notifications go into a folder – she looks directly at basecamp instead. 3rd Party Forms have been reviewed by Ex Libris and sent back with questions for clarification and /or additional data. The ODIN office will wait until the migration forms are completed before distributing additional questions to libraries. The Cataloging User Group continues to have weekly meetings. Load order, de-duplication, overlay, and field retention are big discussion topics. Ex Libris has come back with some conflicting replies to questions so the ODIN Office has been pushing back to Ex Libris to get explanations. Load order needs to be decided by end of November.

- 5) Establish ODIN Advisory Council November meeting date There was discussion and the date determined for the online meeting is Friday, November 22, 2019 9-11am CST. Kotrba will handle logistics.

7) ODIN Strategic Plan 2019-2022 – Action Plan Formation

Kotrba had sent out information about an Action Plan to the OSC members. She asks for feedback. She stressed that an action plan should be changed/updated as the plan progresses. For instance, one of the suggested tasks is that Kotrba form a regional group to discuss issues facing consortia. Members from Minnesota, South Dakota, & North Dakota, possibly from Canada also. Bratton suggested Montana and Kotrba agreed that "regional" should be dropped. Change to a group where anyone could be part of instead of making it regional. The group agreed and the word "regional" was dropped. Walker also mentioned Idaho State and the WICHE librarians – a group that had been very active. Kotrba requested that each OSC member come up with at least one idea for an item on the Action Plan for next month.

8) Other Business -

Kotrba mentioned a Chrome extension has been developed using methodology from Minitex (their ELM extension). Minitex placed instruction out on GitHub and Jason created a prototype which is now under review with ODIN Office staff and the North Dakota State Library. Hopefully it'll be ready to showcase at the next meeting.

Ennen mentioned that the online Voting for the Governance Document has concluded. It was approved and an email will be going out.

Walker commented that the OER Symposium date has been set – March 6, 2020 in Fargo, ND

Mocnik mentioned that the TCU Workshop will be April 1, 2020 at Minnesota State University/Moorhead with Anne Phibbs as the keynote speaker.
