

Koha is the first free and open source library automation package. Equinox's team includes some of Koha's core developers.

Evergreen



Evergreen is a unique and powerful open source ILS designed to support large, dispersed, and multi-tiered library networks.

equinoxEDU

Equinox provides ongoing educational opportunities through equinoxEDU, including live webinars, workshops, and online resources.



Fulfillment is an open source interlibrary loan management system. Fulfillment can be used alongside or in connection with any integrated library system.

CORAL

CORAL is an open source electronic resources management system. Its interoperable modules allow libraries to streamline their management of electronic resources.

FOLIO is an open-source library services platform that integrates print and electronic resource management.

It includes core library management functionality, is built on a modern architecture to ensure continuous innovation, and supports the integration of applications from third-party providers.

EBSCO provides implementation, hosting and support for FOLIO.

- To build Open Library, hundreds of millions of book records, a wiki interface, and lots of people who are willing to contribute their time and effort to building the site are needed.
- To date, Open Library has gathered over 20 million records from a variety of large catalogs as well as single contributions, with more on the way.
- Open Library is an open project: the software is open, the data are open, the documentation is open, and your contributions are welcomed. 

SUPPORT

- ODIN holds contracts for both Ex Libris and Innovative
- Additional contract work must go through Director or Ass't Director of ODIN & evaluated if work benefits all of ODIN or just individual libraries. Who pays for additional contract work is determined by evaluation.
